4. Effects, reactions, and reflections

Based on the activities to sell apples that the students carried out last year, they wanted to discover the best aspects of Yamanouchi town (mainly within the school district of Minami Elementary School) and found them through town exploration. Knowing that there are many hot springs and orchards, as well as solar panels in the school district, they realized that water and electricity are finite, because abundant water sources are essential for hot springs and orchards. To protect such a rich nature and livable town, they had a strong desire to do something about the problem of trash on the streets. They found that last year's 3rd-grade students learned about trash, and that elementary school students picked up trash from the river in the "Support Everyone's Challenge!" activity, they also started activities to pick up trash. But there was more trash on the streets than they thought, and they thought about what to do. At first, many of the students said, "Waste cannot be reduced just by putting up posters." So, they started Operation Clean every other week and felt that the amount of trash was decreasing. However, when they explored the town, they found a poster made by 3rdgrade students last year, and thought, "After all, if we put up posters, people will look at them, and waste may be reduced." Then each of them drew pictures of trash and put them on a large paper to make a poster. The words that the students want to convey are included in the poster. Some of the students said, "We want to include words to make people think about why they shouldn't throw away garbage." They are gradually becoming more interested in the environment.
